### What we offer

The Humanities Department comprises four subjects – Geography, History, Politics and Psychology. Both Geography and History are studied across all key stages, form part of our Key Stage 3 Curriculum, and are option subjects at both Key Stages 4 & 5. Politics and Psychology are option subjects at Key Stage 5 only.

## Successful University Placements

The Department has an excellent track record of exam success and university entry across the four subjects and beyond – for example, in Art History, International Relations and Anthropology.

#### **Student Activities**

Student activities include Geography field trips to the Lake District, and History trips to the Museum of Medicine and the Royal Naval Dockyard in Portsmouth. In addition, our Politics students visit the Palace of Westminster and meet with and question our local MP.

### **Our Subjects**

In Geography, students study a range of topics that relate to both the physical world and human interactions – such as migration and world population.

History helps students make sense of such issues, as it lends the perspective of past generations to current debates.

Politics offers the opportunity to investigate how we legislate.

Whilst Psychology studies mind and behaviour including thoughts, feeling and motives for the actions we take.

But above all, each of these subjects offers students the opportunity to acquire and develop investigative and enquiry based skills which are extremely valuable when progressing to university education, whether studying one of these or a vast range of other subjects.
